Project Spotlights

- ★ FedEx is planning to invest \$200 million in building a new sorting facility at the Ted Stevens Anchorage International Airport.
- ★ In Houston, Alaska, Renewable IPP built the largest solar project in the state.
- ★ The Alaska Marine Highway received \$286 million to bring ferry service to remote areas, build new docks and terminals, and reduce emissions in the transportation sector.
- ★ The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers awarded \$250 million to upgrade and expand the Port of Nome, allowing larger vessels to access the harbor. This will allow for increased commerce to this region that is disconnected from Alaska's highway system, strengthen supply chains, and help lower costs for families.

Infrastructure

\$7.8 billion in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding has been announced to Alaska for **1949 projects**, including:

- \$3.8 billion for transportation, including \$2.4 billion for roads and bridges, \$589 million for public transit, \$253 million for airports, \$326.2 million for ports and waterways.
- \$1.8 billion for high-speed internet since President Biden took office.
- \$885.3 million for clean water, including \$85.7 million to replace toxic lead pipes.

Clean Energy and Climate

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$8 million** in clean power projects, including solar, wind, and batteries with enough energy to power an estimated **1,000 homes.**

\$869.9 million in public funding has been announced for grants, rebates, and other initiatives to accelerate the deployment of clean energy, clean buildings, and clean manufacturing. This is not inclusive of the clean energy tax incentives from the Inflation Reduction Act.

\$38.7 million for clean transportation, including \$31.5 million for EV chargers, \$6.8 million for clean transit buses, and \$400 thousand for clean school buses.

Lowering Costs

- **\$74.5 million** in home energy rebates to cut energy costs by weatherizing homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.
- 116K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's \$2,000 yearly cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs, a \$35 monthly cap per insulin prescription, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and a drug price negotiation program.
- **27K individuals** in Alaska signed up for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces during the Open Enrollment Period for 2024 and will benefit from average savings of about \$800/year from lower health care premiums.
- \$192.4 million in student debt cancellation has been approved for 3.5K people in Alaska under the Biden-Harris Administration.
