CONNECTICUT

\$770 million in private sector commitments and **\$6.7 billion** in public investments in clean energy, infrastructure, and manufacturing under the Biden-Harris Administration

\$429.9M in funding from the Biden Administration to provide affordable, reliable high-speed internet to everyone in Connecticut.



4.4% unemployment rate with **120.6K** new jobs created under the Biden Administration.



\$5.6B announced for transportation investments in roads, bridges, public transit, rail, ports and airports, as well as electric school buses and transit buses, EV charging, and more.



\$292.8M announced to provide clean water across Connecticut and improve water infrastructure. This includes **\$97.4M** dedicated to replacing toxic lead pipes.



729K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries will save money on prescription drug costs.



151.8K applications to start new businesses under the Biden Administration.

Project Spotlights

- ★ ASML plans to invest \$200 million to expand its semiconductor manufacturing facilities in Wilton, creating 1,000 new jobs.
- ★ Blueprint Robotics plans to build \$96 million component production facility in Windsor, which will create 120 jobs.
- ★ The Connecticut Department of Transportation was awarded \$158 million to rehabilitate the Gold Star Memorial Bridge, which connects New York and New England along I-95.
- ★ The Department of Transportation awarded nearly \$827 million to Amtrak to replace the existing Connecticut River Bridge between Old Saybrook and Old Lyme, CT, with a modern and resilient new moveable bridge immediately to the south of the existing structure.

Infrastructure

\$6.5 billion in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding has been announced to Connecticut for **176 projects**, including:

- **\$5.6 billion** for transportation, including \$2.5 billion for roads and bridges, \$702.9 million for public transit, \$73 million for airports, \$91 million for ports and waterways.
- **\$260.3 million** for high-speed internet since President Biden took office.
- **\$292.8 million** for clean water, including \$97.4 million to replace toxic lead pipes.

Clean Energy and Climate

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$1.1 billion** in commitments to invest in clean energy industries, including:

- **\$983.9 million** in clean power projects, including solar, wind, and batteries with enough energy to power an estimated **357,000 homes**.
- **\$150 million** for clean energy manufacturing.

\$306.7 million in public funding has been announced for grants, rebates, and other initiatives to accelerate the deployment of clean energy, clean buildings, and clean manufacturing. This is not inclusive of the clean energy tax incentives from the Inflation Reduction Act.

\$80.7 million for clean transportation, including \$45.5 million for EV chargers, \$26.4 million for clean transit buses, and \$8.8 million for clean school buses.

CHIPS and Science

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$200 million** in private commitments to invest in semiconductors and electronics.

Lowering Costs

- **\$99.4 million** in home energy rebates to cut energy costs by weatherizing homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.
- **729K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries** will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's \$2,000 yearly cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs, a \$35 monthly cap per insulin prescription, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and a drug price negotiation program.
- **129K individuals** in Connecticut signed up for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces during the Open Enrollment Period for 2024 and will benefit from average savings of about \$800/year from lower health care premiums.
- **\$1.2 billion** in student debt cancellation has been approved for **24.5K people** in Connecticut under the Biden-Harris Administration.
