Project Spotlights

- ★ Clearway Energy Group recently completed the construction of two utilityscale solar projects in Mililani and Waiawa, investing over \$285 million. The two projects were estimated to have created over 460 local union jobs during construction.
- ★ The Hawaiian Electric Company is investing a total of \$190 million, which includes a \$95 million grant from the Department of Energy that is funded by President Biden's Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, to limit damage to the electric grid from extreme weather events such as wildfires or hurricanes.
- ★ The Hawai'i Department of Transportation, on behalf of Hawai'i, Kauai, and Maui counties, is receiving \$23 million to buy a mix of zero-emission buses, battery electric buses, and fuel cell electric buses.
- ★ The Daniel K. Inouye International Airport received a \$10 million grant from the Federal Aviation Administration to reconstruct the 40-year-old terminal roadway.

Infrastructure

\$2.3 billion in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding has been announced to Hawai 'i for **125 projects**, including:

- **\$1.6 billion** for transportation, including \$1 billion for roads and bridges, \$235.2 million for public transit, \$190.7 million for airports, \$15.4 million for ports and waterways.
- \$245.5 million for high-speed internet since President Biden took office.
- **\$254.1 million** for clean water, including \$85.7 million to replace toxic lead pipes.

Clean Energy and Climate

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$237.8 million** in commitments to invest in clean energy industries, including:

- \$142.8 million in clean power projects, including solar, wind, and batteries with enough energy to power an estimated 8,000 homes.
- \$95 million for clean energy manufacturing.

\$267.8 million in public funding has been announced for grants, rebates, and other initiatives to accelerate the deployment of clean energy, clean buildings, and clean manufacturing. This is not inclusive of the clean energy tax incentives from the Inflation Reduction Act.

\$85.2 million for clean transportation, including \$17.1 million for EV chargers, \$63.2 million for clean transit buses, and \$5 million for clean school buses.

Lowering Costs

- \$68.4 million in home energy rebates to cut energy costs by weatherizing homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.
- 303K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's \$2,000 yearly cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs, a \$35 monthly cap per insulin prescription, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and a drug price negotiation program.
- **22K individuals** in Hawai 'i signed up for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces during the Open Enrollment Period for 2024 and will benefit from average savings of about \$800/year from lower health care premiums.
- \$347.8 million in student debt cancellation has been approved for 6.1K people in Hawai 'i under the Biden-Harris Administration.
