#### **Project Spotlights**

- ★ Panasonic selected De Soto as the site for a new \$4 billion electric vehicle battery plant, creating roughly 4,000 local jobs and setting the record for the largest private investment in the state's history.
- ★ Scorpion Biological Services is developing a new \$650 million biomanufacturing plant in Manhattan that will specialize in novel biodefense vaccines and therapies.
- ★ The City of Salina has been awarded \$22 million to replace seven bridges in Salina, Kansas. The funding will also go towards new parks as well as new bike and pedestrian trails.
- ★ Midwest Energy will receive nearly \$97 million for transmission system and substation protection upgrades in central and western Kansas. The project will address the transmission capacity, age, and condition of facilities, as well as wildfire mitigation and improved access to renewable energy in western Kansas.

### **Infrastructure**

**\$3.4 billion** in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding has been announced to Kansas for **385 projects**, including:

- **\$2.1 billion** for transportation, including \$1.6 billion for roads and bridges, \$140.6 million for public transit, \$87.3 million for airports, \$23.8 million for ports and waterways.
- \$596.1 million for high-speed internet since President Biden took office.
- \$281 million for clean water, including \$90.5 million to replace toxic lead pipes.

# **Clean Energy and Climate**

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$5.7 billion** in commitments to invest in clean energy industries, including:

- \$1.5 billion in clean power projects, including solar, wind, and batteries with enough energy to power an estimated 318,000 homes.
- \$48 million for clean energy manufacturing.
- \$4.1B in battery and electric vehicle manufacturing.

**\$303.7 million** in public funding has been announced for grants, rebates, and other initiatives to accelerate the deployment of clean energy, clean buildings, and clean manufacturing. This is not inclusive of the clean energy tax incentives from the Inflation Reduction Act.

**\$43.8 million** for clean transportation, including \$22.7 million for EV chargers, \$14.5 million for clean transit buses, and \$6.6 million for clean school buses.

#### **CHIPS and Science**

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$3.7 billion** in private commitments to invest in semiconductors and electronics.

#### **Lowering Costs**

- \$105.6 million in home energy rebates to cut energy costs by weatherizing homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.
- **581K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries** will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's \$2,000 yearly cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs, a \$35 monthly cap per insulin prescription, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and a drug price negotiation program.
- 171K individuals in Kansas signed up for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces during the Open Enrollment Period for 2024 and will benefit from average savings of about \$800/year from lower health care premiums.
- \$1.2 billion in student debt cancellation has been approved for 23.4K people in Kansas under the Biden-Harris Administration.
