Project Spotlights

- ★ Nissan is investing \$500 million to transform its Canton assembly plant to build all-new electric vehicle models. The investment will support retraining and upskilling nearly 2,000 local workers.
- ★ Enviva is investing \$250 million to build a new, sustainable wood bioenergy facility in Stone County.
- ★ Amtrak was awarded over \$178 million for various track and signal-related improvements, upgrades to grade crossings, and station improvements along a key rail corridor in the Gulf Coast region.
- ★ The U.S. Department of Transportation awarded \$60 million to the Mississippi Department of Transportation to widen I-10 in Harrison and Hancock. The project will improve efficiency along a major freight corridor of regional significance.

Infrastructure

\$5.1 billion in Bipartisan Infrastructure Law funding has been announced to Mississippi for **400 projects**, including:

- **\$2.6 billion** for transportation, including \$2.1 billion for roads and bridges, \$121.6 million for public transit, \$94.3 million for airports, \$58.2 million for ports and waterways.
- \$1.4 billion for high-speed internet since President Biden took office.
- \$281 million for clean water, including \$87.8 million to replace toxic lead pipes.

Clean Energy and Climate

Under the Biden-Harris Administration, private companies have announced **\$3.7 billion** in commitments to invest in clean energy industries, including:

- \$1.3 billion in clean power projects, including solar, wind, and batteries with enough energy to power an estimated 219,000 homes.
- \$2.4B in battery and electric vehicle manufacturing.

\$343.3 million in public funding has been announced for grants, rebates, and other initiatives to accelerate the deployment of clean energy, clean buildings, and clean manufacturing. This is not inclusive of the clean energy tax incentives from the Inflation Reduction Act.

\$93.8 million for clean transportation, including \$29 million for EV chargers, \$16.9 million for clean transit buses, and \$47.8 million for clean school buses.

Lowering Costs

- \$104.8 million in home energy rebates to cut energy costs by weatherizing homes and replacing old appliances with more efficient models.
- **634K seniors and other Medicare beneficiaries** will save money on prescription drug costs because of President Biden's \$2,000 yearly cap on out-of-pocket prescription drug costs, a \$35 monthly cap per insulin prescription, free vaccines, inflation rebates, and a drug price negotiation program.
- **286K individuals** in Mississippi signed up for health insurance through the Affordable Care Act Marketplaces during the Open Enrollment Period for 2024 and will benefit from average savings of about \$800/year from lower health care premiums.
- \$1.5 billion in student debt cancellation has been approved for 27K people in Mississippi under the Biden-Harris Administration.
